## 25th ANNUAL EVA LAUVE ADULT— YOUTH TRIOS TOURNAMENT

October 19 & 20, 26 & 27, 2024 at EASTMONT LANES

1. The entry fee for teams shall be \$17.00 per bowler: lineage \$11.00, awards fund \$3.25, scholarship awards \$2.75. Total entry fee per team will be \$51.00.
2. The tournament will be held October 19 & 20 and 26 & 27, 2024 at Eastmont Lanes. Entries open September 16th, 2024. Entries close Sunday, October 27, 2024 before the last squad of bowling.
3. The tournament will be handicapped with one division. Handicap will be 90% of the difference between a bowler's average and 230.
4. Entrants may bowl an unlimited number of times, but teams must change at least one player (identical team rosters are not allowed). Each team must have at least one adult and one youth bowler.
5. Awards will be presented for every five (5) entries (1:5). The Tournament Committee will determine the awards presented.
6. Entrants in the tournament (both adults and youth) shall use their highest certified league average for at least 21 games for the 2023-2024 bowling season. (Book average will be accepted as official.)
  - B. If an adult entrant has no 23-24 book average he/she shall use his/her highest current league average for 9 games or more as of October 19, 2024.
  - C. A Bantam League entrant without a previous season average shall use his/her highest league average for at least 6 games as of the date of his/her participation.
  - D. All other youth entrants without a previous season average shall use their highest average for at least 9 games as of the date of their participation.
  - E. A youth entrant without required number of games for average as of October 19, 2024 will receive a 120 average.
  - F. If none of the above applies, an adult bowler may enter the tournament; however, he/she will use an entering average of 180.
7. Entrants who have established an average in another city or state must submit verification of their average in order to bowl in this tournament. Tournament managers may re-rate any bowler at any time.
8. USBC rules 319 1a and 1b, 319d, and 319e do not apply.
9. It shall be each bowler's responsibility to verify the accuracy of his/her average, whether originally submitted by the bowler, the team captain, or others. Failure to use the correct average shall disqualify the score if the submitted average is lower than the correct average, thereby resulting in more handicap.
10. Awards shall be based on the submitted average if it is higher than the correct average. Corrections in averages may be made within 48 hours after completion of the series if the tournament manager, prior to the completion of the first game of the series, has consented to allow the bowler an extension of time to correct his/her average.
11. Substitutes will be allowed when replacement is necessary. The tournament manager should be advised of substitutions at least one-half hour before the scheduled bowling time or sooner.
12. Any bowler who arrives after the first game of the series has started will be allowed to bowl and his/her score will count beginning in the frame in which the bowler enters the game. However, if a replacement is found and has bowled the first frame, the replacement will be allowed to finish the series. No score will be given for frames missed.
13. Check-in time is 30 minutes prior to squad start time.
14. In the event all lanes are not completely filled on any shift, open bowling will be permitted, provided there shall be one lane left vacant (buffer lane) next to the scheduled tournament bowlers.
15. Lanes will be oiled before the first shift of each day of the tournament.
16. Scholarship funds will be awarded to the youth high series with handicap winners in each of the following divisions: Strikers, Preps, and Bantams. Bowlers will be assigned to divisions based on age as follows: Ages 8 and under: Bantams, Ages 9-12: Preps, Ages 13 and older: Strikers. It is the bowler's (or parent's) responsibility to verify he or she is in the correct division before bowling. The amount of each scholarship will be dependent on number of entries. Total scholarship money from tournament fund will be divided equally between the winners.
17. All youth bowlers must have a current USBC Youth Membership. Membership can be purchased from tournament director. Adult bowlers are not required to be members of USBC.
